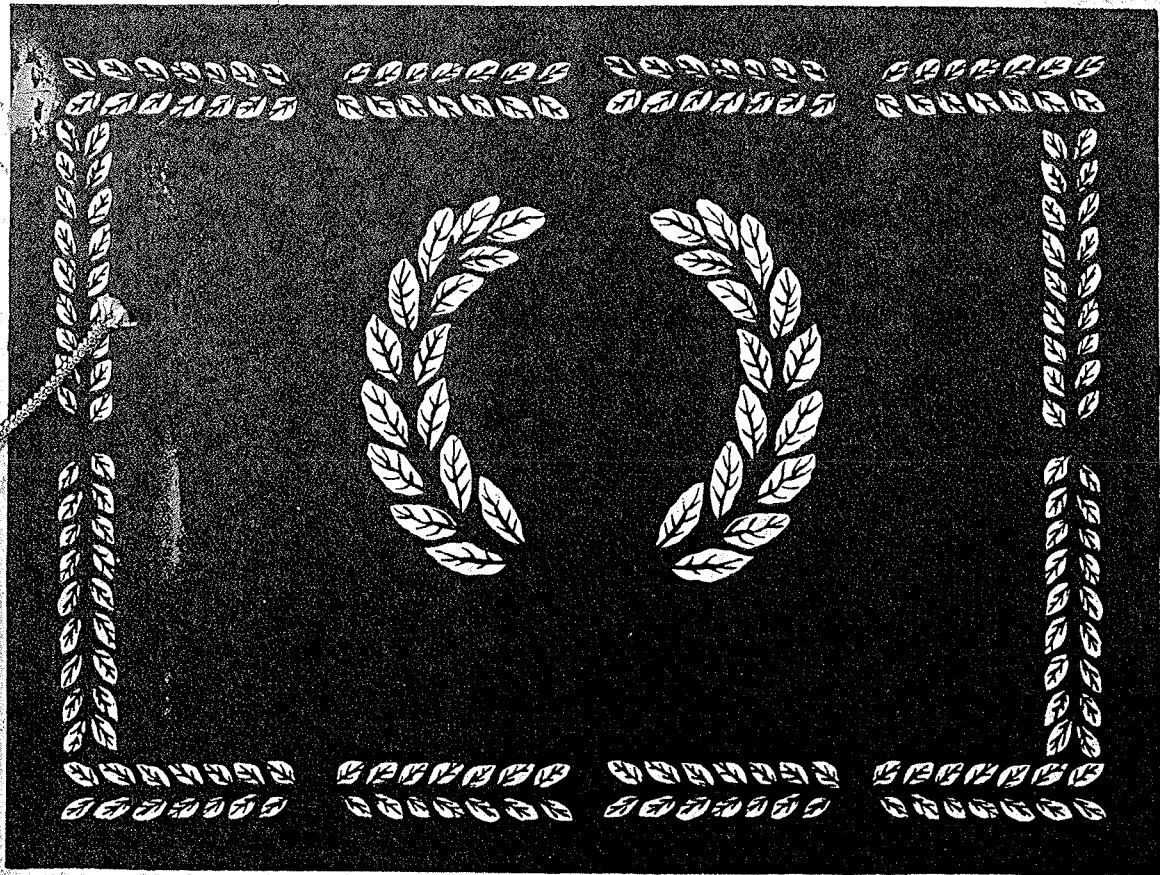

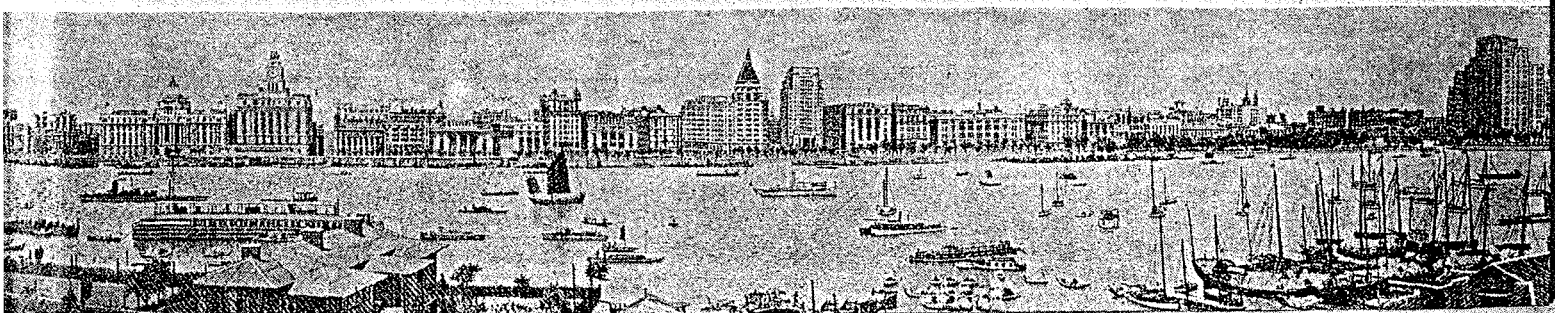
## *A Brief History*

- 8/12 April 1853 Formation of Shanghai Volunteer Corps decided upon by two meetings of representatives from the Three Treaty Powers—Great Britain, the United States and France.
- 4 April 1854 Battle of Muddy Flats.
- August 1860 Corps re-organised into 2 Infantry Companies, each 80 men strong, to assist in defence of Shanghai against attack by Taiping revolutionaries.
- January 1862 Corps engaged against second attack by Taiping Rebels. The Volunteer  
— May 1864 Mounted Rangers, some twenty strong and formed in 1861, augmented the two infantry companies, and were commanded by Captain Borlaise R.N.
- 1865 Artillery Unit organised.
- 1866 Volunteer Fire Brigade Service organised. Captain Roberts elected first Chief Engineer of the MIH-HO-LOONG (Fire Eating Devil) HOOK and LADDER Company.
- 1870 Control of the Shanghai Volunteer Corps handed over to the Council “who shall, through their Chairman, decide upon all questions of organisation, and shall generally control the actions of the Corps.” First Rifle Range constructed at Range Road. The Mih-ho-loong Rifle Company was formed under the command of Captain Ashley. Two 12 pounder muzzle-loading brass howitzers and 500 Schnider rifles were purchased for the Corps which was mobilized to deal with local repercussions from the Tientsin Massacre. Composition of the Corps was now 3 Rifle Companies, Field Artillery Battery and Mounted Rangers.
- 1874 Ningpo Joss House riots. First S.V.C. Band organised.
- 1875 A Gatling gun purchased, at Tls 2,200, for the Corps.
- 1878 Corps re-modelled.
- 1881 Mounted Ranger Company renamed Light Horse Company. Corps route march to Woosung and back.
- 1882 First annual Corps Inspection.
- 1886 A Battery of four Armstrong 3-inch rifled breech-loading 9 pounders presented to the Corps by HBM Government.
- 1889 Home Guard (Veterans) Company formed. First mention of a Drill Hall “It was a matshed of some 40 x 20 yards on the Soochow Creek, well lit with electric light, and well suited for what it was intended”.



- 1891 Yangtze Riots. The Corps' Gatling gun rendered useless by an accident and replaced by a Nordenfeld machine gun. German Company formed.
- 1892 Engineer Company organised. First Portuguese Company formed.
- 1894/5 Sino - Japanese War.
- 1895 Lee Metford rifles issued to the Corps.
- 1896/7 Wheelbarrow riots. New Rifle Range constructed in Paoshan area. Portuguese Coy disbanded.
- 1898 Joss House riots.
- 1899 Home Guard (Veterans) Company re-organised into Reserve Company. This Reserve was augmented by the enrolment of a number of sportsmen armed with fowling pieces and known as the "12 Bore-Irregulars". Light Horse armed with Lances.
- 1900 The Boxer Rebellion. New Drill Hall completed and a Volunteers' Club and Gymnasium inaugurated. An American Company temporarily enrolled, and Japanese and Customs Companies formed on a permanent basis. 6 Maxim machine guns loaned to the Corps by H.B.M. Government and attached to the Field Artillery Company.
- 1903 Maxim (Machine Gun) Company formed.
- 1904/5 Russo-Japanese War. Fiftieth anniversary of the Battle of Muddy Flats celebrated by a public ball given by the Corps.
- 1905 Mixed Court riot. American and Portuguese Companies formed on a permanent basis.
- 1906 Chinese Company formed.
- 1908 Four 15-pounder quick firing guns supplied to Corps by H.B.M. Government.
- 1911 Chinese Revolution.
- 1913 Second Revolution.
- 1914 Outbreak of First World War. Austro-Hungarian, Italian and Scottish Companies formed. Cornerstone of present Drill Hall laid on 4th April. A Motor Car Company with 18 Cars was added to the Corps.
- 1915 Rickshaw coolie strike. Maritime Company formed.
- 1917 Austro-Hungarian and German Companies disbanded.
- 1918 Hawkers Riot. Rickshaw coolie Riot. Anti-Japanese Riot.

- 1921 Four 4.5-inch Howitzers, 900 rifles & 20 Lewis guns provided by H.B.M. Government.
- 1922 Machine Gun Company furnished with 6 Armoured Cars. The S.V.C. Club was formally opened by the Chairman of Council on December 18, with a membership of some 500 Volunteers.
- 1923 New Colours presented to the Corps. American Troop formed.
- 1924 Kiangsu-Chekiang War. "C" Company formed to accommodate Scandinavian, Swiss and Dutch nationals, and furnished with 4 gun battery of mountain guns by H.B.M. Government.
- 1925 May Day (Nanking Road) Incident. Lungwha Battle. Maritime Company disbanded.
- 1927 Occupation of Greater Shanghai by Nationalists. Commandant, S.V.C. (Col. Gordon) assumed command of Internal Security Forces comprising the Volunteer Corps and all National Forces other than the Shaforce. Customs Company disbanded. Filipino Platoon attached to American Company. Inauguration of the Russian Volunteer Unit.
- 1929 Italian Unit disbanded.
- 1932 Sino-Japanese Hostilities. Transport, Jewish, Philippine, American Machine Gun, Field Reserve, Signals, Interpreter and Air Defence Companies formed. Old Engineer Company disbanded.
- 1936 Corp Artillery & Howitzer Battery disbanded. Light Battery became a Machine Gun Company.
- 1937 Sino-Japanese War. Final Mobilization of S.V.C.
- 1940 S.V.C. took over on permanent duty basis the occupation of "B" Sector when British Forces were withdrawn.
- 1941 Settlement taken over by Japanese Forces.
- 1942 Shanghai Volunteer Corps disbanded.
- 1954 Centenary of S.V.C. celebrated by ex-members of Corps residing in Hongkong. Corps Dinner at Royal Hong Kong Yacht Club on 2nd April 1954. Cricket match between S.V.C. and pre-war Hong Kong Volunteers at Hong Kong Cricket Club Ground on Sunday 4th April 1954—the Hundredth Anniversary of the Battle of Muddy Flats.



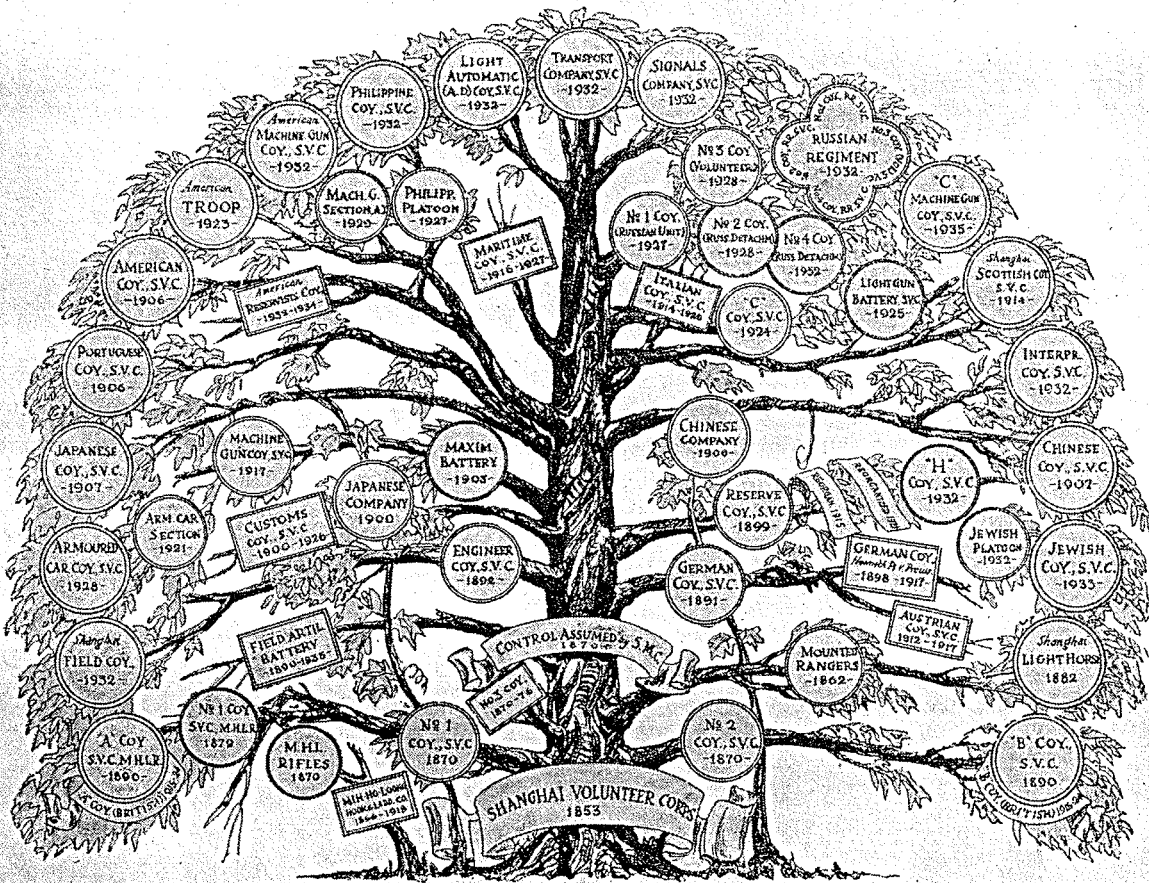

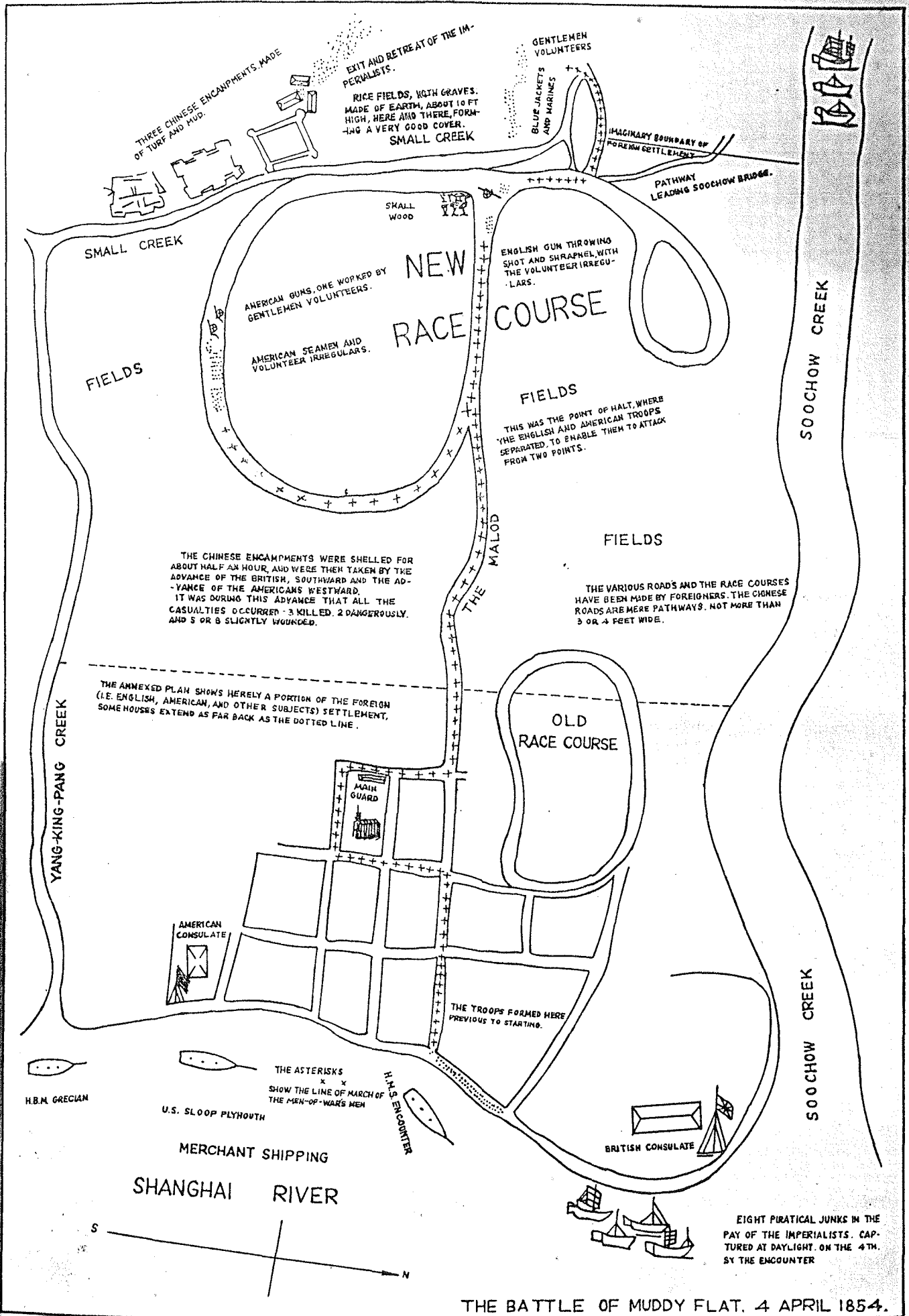

THE CHINESE ENCAMPMENTS WERE SHELLED FOR ABOUT HALF AN HOUR, AND WERE THEN TAKEN BY THE ADVANCE OF THE BRITISH, SOUTHWARD AND THE ADVANCE OF THE AMERICANS WESTWARD. IT WAS DURING THIS ADVANCE THAT ALL THE CASUALTIES OCCURRED - 3 KILLED, 2 DANGEROUSLY, AND 5 OR 8 SLIGHTLY WOUNDED.

THE VARIOUS ROADS AND THE RACE COURSES HAVE BEEN MADE BY FOREIGNERS. THE CHINESE ROADS ARE HERE PATHWAYS, NOT MORE THAN 3 OR 4 FEET WIDE.

THE ANNEXED PLAN SHOWS HERELY A PORTION OF THE FOREIGN (I.E. ENGLISH, AMERICAN, AND OTHER SUBJECTS) SETTLEMENT. SOME HOUSES EXTEND AS FAR BACK AS THE DOTTED LINE.
