I see by the returns of trade published by the Inspector-General of Customs, the Commissioner of Customs at Shanghai estimates the native population at 247,466. These figures of course include the population of the Chinese city of Shanghai and its immediate suburbs.

The number of Foreign and Chinese houses are given below as nearly as I can ascertain them :—

The Council regret that the Native authorities are not disposed to increase the commutation, nor, in the event of its abandonment, to support the Council in collecting dues from Chinese. They feel that the sum received inadequately covers the trade in native produce.

HONGKEW POLICE STATION.

Until a new station is provided, the lease of the old premises has been renewed from month to month.

COST OF BRIDGES OVER YANG-KING-PANG CREEK.

The French Council have agreed to bear half the cost of erecting and maintaining the bridges over the Yang-king-pang Creek.

PUBLIC GARDEN.

The Garden Committee having represented that the amount voted for the maintenance of the garden during the year was insufficient, the Council authorised expenditure to a reasonable amount.

This increase in the native population is owing to well-to-do Chinese coming to carry on business or reside here. The boating population remains about the same, and since the beggar boats formerly lying in the Soochow Creek have been removed, a very small number of beggars and thieves—of which there were in 1870 some 2,085 living in boats and huts—are to be found residing within the limits of the Foreign Settlement at the present time.

HARD LABOUR SYSTEM.

Prisoners sentenced to long terms of imprisonment have been employed on the roads.

SQUATTERS, HONGKEW CREEK.

The camp of squatters which has existed for upwards of 20 years on the east side of the Hongkew Creek near the Seward Road has been removed. Some of the squatters have merely moved to settle down higher up the creek and others in the neighbouring country.

TAIL-CUTTING PANIC.

The tail-cutting panic made its appearance in Shanghai early in May. The Police immediately set to work to discover the mischief.

NATIVE POPULATION.

The Native population shows an aggregate increase of only 12,150 in the last five years, but excluding those dwelling in native villages, huts and boats there is an actual increase of 14,145; the figures being

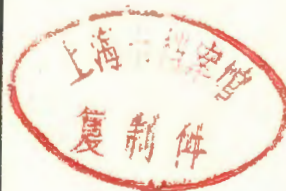

From the above table it appears that since June 1880 there has been an increase of 1,476 in the number of Foreign residents, composed of 604 men, 509 women, and 363 children, and on reference to the annexed table giving the nationalities of the various residents, it will be found that the increase includes 396 British subjects, 427 Japanese, and 172 Portuguese, leaving only 481 of all other nations.

NATIVE POPULATION.

The native population shows the large increase of 17,853 since June 1880, but of these 1,908 reside in villages, huts and boats, which reduces the increase of permanent residents to 15,977.

WATCH MATTERS.

CENSUS OF 1895.

A Census of the Foreigners and Natives residing within the limits of the Settlement and on the outside roads, including Pootung and the Opium Hulks, was taken on the 24th June, which gave the following results:—

showing an increase of 863 during the past five years, of which 358 are children, whilst for the corresponding period from 1885 to 1890 the increase was only 148, including 144 children.

From the annexed table giving the nationalities of the different residents, it will be seen that the increase includes 362 British, 167 Portuguese and 70 Germans, and that there is a decrease of 136 Japanese and 75 Spaniards.

The decrease in the number of Japanese has been caused by the war between Japan and China, nearly the whole of the Japanese population having left the Settlement last year, and they only commenced to return after the cessation of hostilities in May last; since then, however, most of them have returned, and the number now in the Settlement is probably nearly as great as in June 1890.

The above table shows the large increase of 72,866 in the total Native population during the last five years, against an increase of 42,464 from 1885 to 1890, but omitting the Natives residing in villages, huts and boats, whose number is estimated at 14,698, against 17,862 in 1890, the increase in the more permanent residents is 76,030, against 35,097 at the previous census.

The large increase may be attributed in a great measure to the alarm caused to the Natives in different parts of the country by the hostile operations of the Japanese, which induced numbers of them to seek refuge in the Settlement, when it became known that a guarantee had been given that no hostilities could be undertaken against Shanghai and its approaches.

Since the Census was taken a large addition has been made to the Native population, a great many wealthy Chinamen having invested in land and houses and migrated here from different parts along with their wives and families, whilst the numerous latitudes and projected cotton mills are attracting numbers of the working classes.

The principal increase has been in the population of Hongkew, amounting to 58,667, against 17,485 in the English Settlement, the following being the figures:—

It will be noted that, although the population of the English Settlement has increased by 17,485, there is a slight decrease in the number of Native houses, which is to be accounted for by the fact that there were only 202 unoccupied houses on 30th June 1895, against 677 in 1890, whilst a great many blocks of old buildings of the worst description have been pulled down and replaced by larger and more commodious dwellings, affording accommodation for a largely increased number of inhabitants, and in addition to the above a good many more foreign hong are now occupied by Chinese than in 1890.

A Census of the Foreign and Native population residing within the limits of the Foreign Settlement, also of Foreigners living on the Outside Roads, Pootung and Hulks, was taken on the 26th May last, which gave the following results:—

showing an increase of 2,090 or 45 % during the past five years, against 863 or 23 % in 1895. Comparatively the largest increase is in Males, 53 %, against females 45 % and children 31 %.

From the annexed table, giving the nationalities of the different residents, it will be noticed that the principal increase includes:— British 755, Japanese 486, Portuguese 247, Americans 234 and Germans 211.

The decrease in the number of Spanish is caused by Manila residents being previously returned under that nationality, and in this instance they are included under their own heading.

Owing to the unsettled state of the Country a great number of foreigners have, since the census was taken, sought refuge in Shanghai, thereby increasing the above figures considerably.

The Native population shows the large aggregate increase of 104,281 or 43 % since the last census was taken, against 72,866 between the years 1890 and 1895, but omitting those living in villages, huts and boats, the actual increase of inhabitants paying taxes in the Settlement is 83,795, against 76,030 in 1895. The comparatively large increase in the number living in villages and huts is caused by the Settlement extension, as those in the Western and lower Eastern Districts were not included in the previous census.

Almost immediately after the census was taken, a great exodus of Natives, principally women and children, commenced, variously estimated from 30,000 to 50,000, caused through the Boxer movement in the North, which they were afraid would spread to Shanghai, and that the authorities here would not be able to protect them. In connection with this exodus and the consequent stagnation of trade, the number of unoccupied houses increased from 3,104 on 30th June to 6,655 on 30th September, and as yet no perceptible decrease can be recorded, although the men are now gradually returning to Shanghai.

CENSUS.

A Census of the Foreign and Native population residing within the limits of the Foreign Settlement, also of Foreigners living on the Outside Roads and Pootung, was taken on October 15, 1910. The returns are tabulated and detailed forms are appended which give the following results :—

showing an increase of 2,039 or 17.7 per cent during the past five years.

Comparatively the largest increase is in females, 27.6 per cent against children 22.9 per cent and males 9.9 per cent.

From the table of nationalities it will be seen that the principal increases include :—

British 752, Japanese 1,204 and Portuguese 164.

Indians are as heretofore shown separately and are not included under "British."

The development of the French Outside Roads and the consequent increase in the Foreign population of the French Settlement and environs from 834 in 1905 to 1,476 in 1910 bear upon the returns, while the fact that the Census was taken on a Saturday night when a number of Foreigners were up country or at Henli probably had a slight effect.

There is now a large Native population living on the outskirts of the Settlement on or near Municipal roads. It has been found impossible to obtain any definite statistics of these, but those living in houses on which the special 6 per cent rate is collected are estimated as under :—

A Census of the Foreign and Chinese population residing within the limits of the Foreign Settlement, also of Foreigners living on the Outside Roads and Pootung, was taken on October 16, 1915. The returns are tabulated and detailed forms are appended which give the following results :—

From the table of nationalities it will be seen that the principal increases include :—

Japanese 3,808, British 357 and American 367.

Indians are as heretofore shown separately and are not included under "British."

The war has doubtless had an effect on the returns in so far as it has diminished the number of males of some nationalities and increased the number of females who are using Shanghai as a neutral place of refuge.

PRESERVATION OF THE PHEASANT.

Correspondence with Mr. A. P. Nazer and others on the subject of the preservation of the pheasant:—

Shanghai, July 2, 1920.

SIR,—With a view to giving the pheasant some slight protection against the ever increasing slaughter which is taking place, and which destruction would point to the possible extinction of this game bird within a few years, we, the undersigned, respectfully beg to make the suggestion that the Council frames and enforces a regulation that no hen pheasant be allowed to be sold within the Settlement for a period of three years, commencing from October, 1920.

To prevent any possibility of the regulation being evaded by removing the feathers from the birds, all pheasants exposed for sale should have their feathers on.

A similar application is being made to the French Municipal Council, and if the regulation is brought into force, it is hoped, and anticipated, that the various Treaty Ports will adopt it also.

"Notice is hereby given that the sale of hen pheasants and of pheasants denuded of their feathers, will be prohibited for a period of three years, commencing on October 1, 1920. During the close season, February 17 to September 30 inclusive, the sale of pheasants is absolutely prohibited."

CENSUS.

The quinquennial census of the International Settlement was taken in October, the count being based on the number of persons who passed the night of October 23 within the census area. The delivery of forms to residents began on October 22 and was completed the next day. Collection commenced on October 24 and continued until October 26. The tabulation commenced on October 25, 1935, and the work was completed by January 16, 1936.

Four types of declaration forms were used, viz., Chinese language, English, Japanese and Russian. The forms previously used were revised for this census so that their scope would be wider than in 1930. In this connection it should be stated that early in the year the Council decided that in this census information should be called for from the Chinese population as well as the foreign as to age groups into which they fall and that the co-operation of the French Municipal Administration and the Shanghai City Government Authorities might be invited, with a view to providing co-ordinated census data in respect of the three municipal areas, particularly in regard to age groups and density of population per unit of area. An accord in principle was arrived at with the French Municipal Administration on all points, except the taking of the French Concession census in 1935, instead of in 1936. The French authorities agreed, however, to take their 1936 census at the latter end of October of that year. The City Government agreed to collaborate on the desired lines when taking their census in 1935. The Council also decided to appoint a statistician specially to supervise the census work and this was done.

As regards the Outside Roads areas it was decided that foreign residents only should be counted as in previous years, the Shanghai City Government having agreed to furnish data regarding Chinese residents. An exodus from Chapei in November prompted by fear of disturbances created such an unusual population situation coincident with the taking of the City Government census that the Authorities decided to retake their census when conditions had practically returned to normal.

It is hoped that in future the census of the three Municipalities will be taken on the same day so that a complete total for the three areas might be arrived at with greater accuracy.

The most important alterations in the Settlement declaration forms were :—

- (1) In the Chinese form, four age groups were included in the place of the simple distinction "Children" and "Adults" heretofore used. These groups are now shown as Under 5, 5-15, 15-20 and over 20.
- (2) In the old style form applicable to Chinese, servants were shown separately from the other occupants of the house. This distinction not being relevant to a per capita showing was not preserved. The total of servants has been shown under the classification of professions.
- (3) The number of families per house was added in place of the "servant" details. Municipal Departments attach value to the acquisition of this information.

In addition to the statistics compiled in the 1930 census and to the above-mentioned new age groups, the following new items were enumerated :—Number of Chinese families per house, and rank, profession and calling of Chinese. Returns in respect of this latter classification have now been tabulated for the first time locally.

In the English form the age column was replaced by five age groups. The actual age was not called for, the declarant having simply to indicate the group in which he or she falls by placing the mark "x" in the appropriate column. The groups are Under 5, 5-15, 15-25, 25-45, and over 45.

The tabulation of the foreign population (Settlement and Outside Roads) according to nationalities was prepared to show 51 nationalities by sex, adults and children and the various districts in which they reside.

Present day national nomenclatures have been used and the previous practice of showing sundries has been discontinued and replaced by a full detailed nationality count.

As regards the occupational count, in the 1930 census 181 callings of foreigners only were listed by districts, but without distinction as to nationality, sex or age. This year it was decided to tabulate Chinese occupations and to explore the practicability of listing occupations by nationalities in a separate additional table. To ensure that the results should be grouped on a recognized scientific basis the classification of the International Labour Office, Geneva, was studied and applied. To simplify the process of tabulation of the foreign occupational count an alphabetical list of occupations was used, the necessary information later being extracted and fitted as far as possible into the classification advocated by the International Labour Office.

When drawing up the list of Chinese occupations, the occupational list of foreigners had to be supplemented with a number of typically Chinese occupations. On the basis of this combined list the enumerators prepared a count-sheet in Chinese, grouped in such a way as to make tabulation possible. The drafting of this sheet presented no mean problem since it involved the placing of 164 occupations in such a manner as to permit of each calling occupying a logical and thus easily found position in the table without undue strain on the enumerators' memory.

A detailed occupational count by nationalities and sexes was compiled and was available for scrutiny at the Secretariat.

Modern occupational grouping, it is hoped, will facilitate comparison in future years; but makes general comparison with 1930 figures impracticable. The Chinese occupational count has, as mentioned above, been taken for the first time.

The general nationality count was completed inside a month. The figures show an increase in the Settlement population since 1930 of 151,081, represented by an increase in the Chinese population in the International Settlement of 149,463 and the foreign population of 1,618. Foreigners residing on the Outside Roads have increased by 826.

PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES.

SHANGHAI TELEPHONE COMPANY.

Revision of Tariff.—The Shanghai Telephone Company applied to the Council on January 18, for revision of its tariff in order to give a net return equal to 8 per cent per annum plus 2 per cent per annum on the capital invested in the business in accordance with the provisions of the Franchise Agreement dated August 5, 1930.

The revised tariff submitted by the Company involved an increase in revenue of roughly 23 per cent and provided for the introduction of the message rate as regards business telephones. The following is a summary of rates at the date of application and of the proposed revised rates per mensem given in dollars:—

These rates, the Company asked, should come into effect on April 1, 1935.

The Company submitted that it had effected all possible economies in construction and operation, consistent with good service, but that the net returns were inadequate, and under the conditions then existing were likely so to remain. It was stated that the net return on the capital invested was in 1934, equivalent to 6.13 per cent and that in order to increase this figure to 10 per cent it was estimated that an overall increase in gross revenues amounting to 22.89 per cent was required. To achieve this it would be necessary either to increase tariffs by a flat percentage or to distribute more equitably service charges between individual subscribers by adopting the message rate principle.

The Company considered the second alternative as being the more equitable, at least as regards business telephones. Also it was felt that Shanghai had outgrown the flat rate system which is inequitable in operation as between large and small users.
